Mowing Schedule 2024 Mahoning valley Guidines

- -Approximately 20-25 acres mowable
- -Zero-turn or "lawn" tractors" of any width are acceptable. Although anything wider than 72" will not be able to make it to the backside of the camp over the bridge. Zero-turn mowers are more desirable because they are easier to maneuver in some areas. The camp owns 3-60" zero-turn country clipper mowers controlled with a single joystick. They can be used if someone is familiar with those controls and comfortable using that machine. Let me know so I can have them fueled and ready to go.
- -The more mowers, the easier the task. But a typical mowing crew usually has at least 4 mowers and 1or 2 grass weed eaters
- -Depending on the mowing season, crews usually arrive between 8-9 am. If there's a question whether it's too wet, stormy, etc, you can call *Jeremy Souders* @ <u>765-571-2811</u> to get the latest updates on conditions. Also, call if you wonder if the grass is not tall enough to mow due to lack of rain.
- Bring your lunch/water. Some crews meet at a local restaurant, have breakfast, and come out to mow. Bathrooms are available and open in the dining hall.
- The camp is divided by Ben Davis Creek. A bridge connects the 2 sections. It is only big enough to support a mower with a 72" deck or less.
- -I will try to send a "rough" map that we have to help show what areas need to be mowed weekly.
- -We ask that all mowers set the mowing depth to 3" and coordinate with each other to ensure that mowers that might be mowing in the same area cut at approximately the same height.
- -There is a section of grass across from the main entrance that does not belong to the camp, but we ask that groups mow it to keep the front area looking nice. It is on the north side of the road. The grass helps a local farmer so he doesn't have to bring in his equipment.
